Horsham Matters



Horsham Matters is a Christian charity that aims to demonstrate love of our neighbour, by relieving hardship through the provision of essential services in order to make a positive, long-lasting impact on people's lives. They run the Horsham District foodbanks (across a range of locations around the district) as well as providing other services such as essential household items for those setting up home. Increasingly they are working to provide advice and guidance (such as help with budgeting) to those in need, to help them avoid getting to the point of crisis. They have recently launched their advice vehicle to go out to villages where residents struggle to access information. Their long term aim is to eradicate the need for foodbanks.

Horsham Matters needs can be summed up as -
